### Rams On Road At BYU

Colorado State looks for its fourth win in a row Saturday night at BYU in a MWC showdown. The Rams won for the third time in a row, stopping Utah four times in a goal-to-go situation en route to a 21-17 win. CSU scored the game-winner on RB Kyle Bell's 49-yard run with 5 minutes 5 seconds to play in the game and rallied from a 14-3 deficit for the win. CB Robert Herbert (10 tackles) keyed a defensive surge, while DE Jesse Nading was credited with the game-saving tackle. Saturday's game will be telecast by Fox Sports Net Rocky Mountain. Under MWC guidelines, the game can only be shown in CSU's home market, which includes the Denver metro area and Fort Collins north to the Wyoming border. The game will not be available in other areas of the state or country, via cable or satellite.

### Clean And Dirty

Throughout the 2005 season, CSU's media relations office will track "clean" and "dirty" throws by the team's quarterbacks. A clean throw is one where there is no defensive pressure or a defensive hurry, while a dirty throw is a passing attempt with defensive pressure present. In the past three games, Holland has completed 45-of-61 passes for 734 yards and five touchdowns with one interception on clean throws.

### First In A Month

Colorado State's game at BYU marks the Rams' third road game of the season, but first since Sept. 10, a span of 35 days (five weeks).

### Win Streaks

Colorado State carries a three-game win streak into this week's game, the first time since the 2003 season the Rams have won three in a row. Colorado State has not won four in a row since a six-game streak in 2002. Colorado State is also 2-0 in conference play for the first time since 2002.

### MWC Record

Colorado State is 31-13 in 43 MWC games since 1999 when the conference was formed. The Rams are 17-6 at home, 14-7 on the road in MWC action.

### Rushing Game Starts

RB Kyle Bell, who has had three consecutive 100-yard rushing games, has the third highest rushing total for the first five games of a season in school history. The list includes:

### In Provo

Colorado State has split four games played in Provo against BYU during the Sonny Lubick era which began in 1993. The Rams won their last visit, 58-13, in 2003. Colorado State has won back-to-back games in the series in Provo only twice: 1953 and '55, and 1947 and '49.

### Few Sacks

Through five games, Colorado State's offensive line has allowed only three sacks for 14 yards lost. By comparison, through four games in 2004, the Rams had allowed 11 sacks for 100 yards lost.

### The Bell Tolls

RB Kyle Bell's season highlights include:

- Bell leads the league in rushing and is 10th nationally, averaging 120.8 yards per game.
- He is the first back since Cecil Sapp in 2002 with three consecutive 100-yard rushing games.
- Colorado State has 18 "explosive" rushes longer than 10 yards, of which Bell has 15 of the runs.
- He scored the game-winning touchdown against Utah with a 49-yard run with 5 minutes, 5 seconds to play in the game.
- Bell rushed 12 times for 33 yards in the first half, then carried 13 times for 111 yards in the second half of the win over Utah.
- Of Bell's 140 yards against Utah, 110 came after initial contact (see chart in following pages).

### Media Guidelines

- All interviews must be coordinated through director for media relations Gary Ozzello or assistant Mike Lefler.
- Interviews are prohibited from conflicting with classes, practice sessions, meetings or medical treatment.
- On-site interviews must take place at the conclusion of practice near the locker room entrance.
- Home telephone numbers for student-athletes will not be released to the media.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted on the practice fields, in the locker room, or training room.
- Interviews with student-athletes the day before a game are restricted to network television for use during a game telecast.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted the day of a game.
- Media members are prohibited from interviewing student-athletes on the sidelines during all practices, including injured student-athletes not participating in a practice session.
- Coach Lubick is available for radio and newspaper interviews each Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 11-11:30 a.m. All requests should be forwarded to athletic media relations director Gary Ozzello at least 24 hours in advance of a requested interview.
- Coach Lubick is available for questions via the Mountain West Conference Coaches Teleconference scheduled each Tuesday morning throughout the season.

### Postgame Procedures

- All players must report immediately to the locker room area before conducting interviews of any kind.
- Coach Sonny Lubick will meet with the media in a designated interview area at the conclusion of a 10-minute cooling period. When his remarks have concluded, he will then appear on a live network radio show, and the team locker room is open to the media.

### Fourth-Quarter Combacks

Colorado State's 21-17 come-from-behind win over Utah is the third largest fourth-quarter comeback in school history. CSU trailed 14-3 entering the fourth quarter. The top three comebacks:

- 20 Air Force 41, Colorado State 21; 1996; CSU wins, 42-41.
- 13 Denver 19, Colorado State 6; 1955; CSU wins, 20-19
- 11 Utah 14, Colorado State 3; 2005; CSU wins, 21-17.

### Comebacks, Part II

Colorado State's fourth-quarter rally against Utah marked the first time since Sept. 28, 2002 CSU trailed entering the final period and won. That day, CSU trailed at Nevada before winning, 32-28.

### Charting The Offense

- QB Justin Holland leads the league and is 14th nationally in passing efficiency, 154.3
- Holland has thrown for eight touchdown passes in the past three games, and has at least one scoring pass in each game to date.
- In the second half of the win over Utah, Holland completed 10-of-11 passes for 110 yards and two touchdowns.
- On CSU's final scoring drive of the night the Rams did not attempt a pass. RB Kyle Bell rushed five times for 77 yards on the drive.
- Colorado State's offensive line did not allow a sack despite missing two regulars (OC Albert Bimper, OG Josh Day). In their place, Nick Allotta made his first career start (second overall) at center, while OG Jerome Williams made his first career start.

### Charting The Defense

- CSU has outscored its opponents 35-13 in the first quarter in 2005. Utah became the first team to score a first-period touchdown against CSU.
- Colorado State now has nine sacks in five games; CSU did not have nine sacks until the seventh game of 2004.
- Colorado State has made six pass interceptions, more than the team had in seven games last season.
- S Miles Kochevar now has 102 career tackles.
- CB Robert Herbert led CSU with 10 tackles in the game, the first time in 2005 a Ram defender has been in double figures in tackles.

### Opening Drives

Colorado State since 1993 is **32-10** in games the Rams have scored on the opening drive of the game. CSU is **13-26** in games the opponent has scored on the opening drive.

### First Scores

Colorado State is **67-13** since 1993 when the Rams score first in a game. The Rams are **30-37** since 1993 when the opponent scores first.

### No Scores Following T.O.

Last week's win over Utah marked the first time in 2005 the Rams did not surrender points following a turnover. Coincidentally, QB Justin Holland's pass interception in the game was CSU's first inside the red zone in 2005.

### Last Year

QB Justin Holland threw for 359 yards and a touchdown, including 12 passes for a career-most 232 yards in the meeting of the teams on Homecoming at Colorado State last season. BYU scored 14 fourth quarter points en route to a 31-21 win before 32,511 fans at Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium. BYU put 10 points on the board in the second quarter. Anderson's six-yard scoring pass from Holland drew CSU within three, 10-7 at halftime. Each team added a third period touchdown.

### Next Week

Colorado State returns home to face Border War rival Wyoming at Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium.

### League Play

Colorado State has an impressive 67-25 (72.9 percent) record in 92 conference games since Sonny Lubick's arrival as head coach in 1993.

### Sack Attack

The Rams have nine quarterback sacks to date. Colorado State, in 2004, did not record the team's ninth sack until the seventh game of 2005.

### Rushing Defense

Colorado State has allowed **63** individual 100-yard rushing performances since 1993. The Rams are **33-26** in games where an opponent rusher has gained 100 or more yards and **57-22** when an opponent does not have a 100-yard rusher.

### MWC Starts & Finishes

## Stadium Facts

Since Sonny Lubick's arrival in 1993, Colorado State has won nearly 75 percent of the team's home games. Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium has been the site to some of the greatest games in school history, and national and regional television broadcasts take place at nearly every home game.

The stadium lies at the base of the foothills of the Rocky Mountains, about two miles west of the main campus area and in one of the most scenic settings to be found anywhere. In 2000, permanent lighting standards were installed, then 4,400 additional permanent seats were constructed in the north end zone for the beginning of the 2004 season.

**Tributes Numerous**

Colorado State football coach Sonny Lubick has been paid many tributes during his 13 seasons at the helm.

For instance, he has been honored as the conference coach of the year four times.

In 1994, *SPORTS ILLUSTRATED* honored the personable Lubick as its national coach of the year. That same year he received several national recognition from several other organizations as well.

But perhaps the greatest tribute and a testimony to what he has meant not only to Colorado State's football program but the entire athletics department, university community and the region came in May of 2003.

During the announcement of a \$15.2 million gift by Pat Stryker and the Bohemian Foundation to renovate and expand the school's football stadium, officials announced that the field would be named in Lubick's honor.

That "Sonny" spring day will long be remembered as one of the greatest moments in Rams' athletics history. Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium is undergoing significant changes that will expand the capacity, provide two new scoreboards including a state-of-the-art video replay board, expanded premium club level seating, and

the addition of luxury suites. There will also be a new playing field installed, as well as other fan amenities to provide Ram fans the finest spectator experience.

More than anything else, the gift and the ensuing renovation and expansion serve as daily reminders what Lubick has meant not only to the football program, but to the athletic department in general and the university as a whole.

It is more than his performance on the field, which has been remarkable: 6 conference titles, 8 bowl appearances, and ranking among the top 15 programs nationally in total victory.

Lubick has won 95 games in 12 seasons including four times guiding the Rams to 10 or more victories in a campaign.

It is more about who he is as a person, a husband, and father, more about what he stands for and cares about.

In December of 2003, Lubick was named one of four national finalists for the Eddie Robinson Coach of Distinction Award for his

community service work and success with the Rams' program.

In the summer of 2003, he was recognized by the American Diabetes Association's Colorado Chapter as a "Father of the Year." He is an annual contributor and participant in several local and national charities, including the St. Jude's Children's Hospital campaign.

Each spring, Lubick can be spotted visiting local elementary schools to visit students about the importance of education and being a solid citizen.

On the school's campus, he has achieved celebrity status, not because of the success and recognition he has generated for the entire institution, but for his gentle nature and caring personality.

In May of 2005, he was accorded another honor, having been named the Citizen of the Year by the Fort Collins Board of Realtors.

Those who have had the pleasure of dealing with Lubick quickly recognize why he has succeeded as a coach.

**Personal Philosophy**

Lubick cares deeply about the people around him - from the members of his coaching staff to every player on the roster. He has built Colorado State's program into one of the nation's finest with hard work, dedication, and a commitment to helping people attain success.

He has a philosophy he shares not only with his team, but with the community and Ram fans nationwide:

- **Responsibility:** Having each member of Colorado State's program take responsibility for their actions and impact on the success of the team.
- **Character:** Lubick places a premium on student-athletes who display integrity and honesty.
- **Respect:** Earning respect among peers, fans, and colleagues remains more important to the veteran coach than gaining popularity.
- **Keep winning and losing in perspective:** Sonny Lubick keeps his program on an even keel - not too high after a monumental victory, of which there have many during his career, nor too low following defeat. Lubick has the presence in the program to keep his program focused on the goal ahead.

- **Work hard and enjoy what you do:** Sonny Lubick's work ethic, dedication and enthusiasm is contagious to those around the Rams' program. He also firmly believes that individuals in any situation perform at peak levels when they enjoy what they are doing.

Lubick's philosophy has paid tremendous dividends to Colorado State's program. Consider that in 11 seasons, he has won 91 games and appeared in 8 bowl games while win-

ning 6 conference titles.

### **Rams' Success Unmatched**

In 11 seasons prior to his arrival, the Rams' program tasted victory only 47 times and played in a single bowl game.

He is without question the most successful coach in school history and has earned the reputation as one of the nation's finest football coaches. He has brought unmatched success and popularity to the base of the Rocky Mountains with his style and grace.

"People know who Colorado State is now. When we go to a bowl game, and see the fans and students enjoying the game, that's what we talk about as coaches and makes us excited," Lubick said.

Lubick is quick to credit his staff and the student-athletes for the program's prominence.

"It's about good coaches and having good student-athletes. Players know they are being treated fairly and that this is a good place," said Lubick

"It takes all of us to have a good program: the student-athletes, coaches, staff, the student body. Those are the little things that make big things happen."

While Lubick is pleased with the program's progress, he is not satisfied or complacent.

"I'm proud to be part of something like this," he said of the Rams' achievements. "But we're going to keep pushing to get better. We want to maintain a solid program that has respect throughout

the country. Other coaches from around the country look at our program and know something good is going on here."

### **Program Milestones**

The Rams under Lubick have:

- Earned 8 bowl invitations in 10 seasons, more than any other MWC team and among the most appearances nationally;
- Won or shared six conference titles;
- Won conference games since than any other MWC program;
- The Rams rank among the top 15 programs nationally in total victories since 1994;
- Seven times since 1994, the team has won eight or more games in a season. Four times - the only times in school history it has happened- the Rams have won 10 (three times) or more (11) games in a season.
- Twice, in 1999 and again in 2002, the Rams completed a "Front Range" sweep by beating Air Force, Colorado and Wyoming.
- In 2002 for the first time in school history, Colorado State owned wins over AFA, BYU, Colorado, Utah and Wyoming in the same season.

MWC head coach. The veteran coach also ranks among the national leaders in career victories.

The Rams' program has attained lofty status with 10 consecutive winning seasons from 1994-2002, among the highest totals in the nation.

Success on the field has been transformed into overall popularity of the program. Colorado State, since Lubick's arrival, has appeared in 97 regional and national television games.

In 2003, Colorado State finished among the top 15 programs nationally in percent capacity, 102.1, having drawn more than 183,000 fans for 6 home games, 30,631 per contest. All of those figures rank among the top three in school history.

Additionally, the top eight home season and individual game attendance records have come during Lubick's career at Colorado State.
