MEDIA GUIDELINES

- All interviews must be coordinated through director for media relations Gary Ozzello or assistant Mike Lefler.
- Interviews are prohibited from conflicting with classes, practice sessions, meetings or medical treatment.
- On-site interviews must take place at the conclusion of practice near the locker room entrance.
- Home telephone numbers for student-athletes will not be released to the media.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted on the practice fields, in the locker room, or training room.
- Interviews with student-athletes the day before a game are restricted to network television for use during a game telecast.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted the day of a game.
- Media members are prohibited from interviewing student-athletes on the sidelines during all practices, including injured student-athletes not participating in a practice session.
- Coach Lubick is available for radio and newspaper interviews each Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 11-11:30 a.m. All requests should be forwarded to athletic media relations director Gary Ozzello at least 24 hours in advance of a requested interview.

POSTGAME PROCEDURES

- All players must report immediately to the locker room area before conducting interviews of any kind.
- Coach Sonny Lubick will meet with the media in a designated interview area at the conclusion of a 10-minute cooling period. When his remarks have concluded, he will then appear on a live network radio show, and the team locker room is open to the media.

NEW PLAYING SURFACE

CSU's football team has a state-of-the art synthetic playing field at Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium in 2006, thanks to an additional gift to the original stadium project by benefactor Pat Stryker, who made a gift of \$1.2 million for the installation of a new "Field Turf" surface. In 2003, the Bohemian Foundation made a \$15.2 million gift to the University to fund the renovation of the Stadium, which included the addition of more than 4,000 seats in the north end zone, two new scoreboards and a new video board, 12 new luxury suites, an expanded premium club seating area, and renovated press box.

BIRTHDAY PARTY

Rams' OT Clint Oldenburg will celebrate his 23rd birthday with more than 70,000 of his closest friends. Oldenburg's birthday is Sept. 9, the same date as the Rams face Colorado in Denver.

T.V. IN DENVER

All six of the previous games between Colorado State and Colorado played in Denver have been telecast regionally or nationally. This year's game will be shown nationally by CSTV. In the past six games, three were shown by ESPN2, and one each was telecast by ESPN, Fox, and ABC, respectively.

LUBICK VS. COLORADO COACHES

When the Rams face instate rival Colorado the second game of the season in Denver, it will mark the third different Buffalo coach that Rams' mentor Sonny Lubick has faced. Lubick lost Colorado in Boulder in 1995, Rick Neuheisel's first year at the helm. Lubick and the Rams defeated CU and then-first-year coach Gary Barnett, 41-14 in 1999 in Denver. This season, the Rams face CU and first-year coach Dan Hawkins in Denver Sept. 9.

2-0 STARTS

Colorado State, with a victory in this week's game, would be 2-0 for the fifth time in Sonny Lubick's 14 seasons at the helm. The most recent 2-0 start by the Rams came in 2002, when Colorado State opened the season with wins at Virginia and against Colorado in Denver before losing at UCLA.

NEXT WEEK

Colorado State plays at Nevada next Saturday. Game time is 6 p.m. PT/7 p.m. MT. There is no live or taped delay television coverage planned for the game. Following the Nevada game, Colorado State has an open date Sept. 23, before travelling to Fresno State Sept. 30. There is no live or taped delay television coverage planned for the game at Fresno State.

RAMS-BUFFS GAME AT INVESCO

Colorado State's game with in-state rival Colorado returns to INVESCO Field at Mile High for the first time since 2002 after a two-season hiatus. The rivals meet Sept. 9 in Denver (time, television to be announced). The Rams and CU played in Denver six times beginning in 1998 through 2003. The first three games of six-game series in Denver were played at Mile High Stadium, the most recent three at INVESCO Field at Mile High. The capsule includes:

In six previous games played in Denver, the game has drawn a total of 443,712 fans, 73,952 per game. The largest crowd of the six previous games was in 2003, the most recent contest, when 76,219 fans attended the game.

RAMS-BUFFS SERIES NOTES

- Colorado has won the past three games in the series by a total of 13 points, including back-to-back three-point wins in 2004 (27-24) and 2005 (31-28) in Boulder.
- The Buffaloes also won the most recent meeting in Denver, 42-35 in 2003 in a game that included a game delay due to lightning.
- Colorado State's last win in the series came in 2002, 19-14 in Denver.
- The teams play for the seventh time in Denver. Each team has won three times in Denver.
- Colorado leads the overall series, 56-20-2.

LAST TIME IN DENVER

Colorado State and Colorado last met in Denver on Aug. 30, 2003 at INVESCO Field at Mile High. After trailing twice in the game by 14 points, Colorado State rallied to tie the score at 35 with under two minutes to play in the game, but a late Colorado touchdown handed the Buffs a 42-35 win before 76,219 fans. The game included a 28-minute delay due to thunder and a rainstorm.

LAST CROWD IN DENVER

The teams played before 76,219 fans in Denver in 2003, the largest crowd to ever witness a college sporting event in state history.

OFFENSIVE NUMBERS

The past three games between the teams have featured high-powered offensive showings by both teams. Colorado State has averaged 472.7 yards in total offense the past three meetings while Colorado has averaged 424 yards in those same three games.

CLOSE CALLS

The past four meetings of the teams have all been narrow decisions. The four games - including three wins by CU by a total of 13 points - have been decided by a total of 18 points. Each of the past two games have been decided by three points.

SEASON BAROMETER

Colorado State has beaten CU three times during Sonny Lubick's tenure in Fort Collins. In those three seasons, the Rams have averaged 9.3 wins (28-10 overall record), and have won or shared the conference title all three times and played in three bowl games. In seasons where the Rams have lost the game to Colorado, the team has averaged 7.3 victories (58-39 record), won or shared two conference titles and played in five bowl games.

LONE STAR STARTER

QB Caleb Hanie is the first Texan to open a season at quarterback under Rams' coach Sonny Lubick. Since 1993, the Rams have boasted a trio of Coloradans (Justin Holland, 2004, '05; Matt Newton, 1999, 2000; Ryan Eslinger (1998) and two Californians (D.J. Busch, 2001; Moses Moreno, 1995) to open the season. No Texan has been the team's opening-game starter in the past 50 seasons.

RAMS AT HOME

Colorado State is 49-20 in home games during Lubick's tenure. The Rams are 26-5 in home nonconference games since 1993. The nonconference losses have been at the hands of Oregon (1993), Colorado (1996), Fresno State (2001), Miami of Ohio (2003), and Minnesota (2004).

LUBICK SECOND ON LIST

Rams' coach Sonny Lubick is in his 14th season at the helm in 2006. Only Harry Hughes, who was the school's football coach for 31 years, had a longer tenure than Lubick. Hughes was 125-93-18 during his career. Lubick has a 102-57-0 record, and has the highest winning percentage, 64.1, of any coach in school history. He has led CSU to six conference titles and nine bowl games.

FIVE WEEKS

After having opened the 2006 season at home with a win over Weber State, the Rams will now wait five weeks before playing at Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium. Following this week's game with Colorado, the Rams play at Nevada Sept. 16, then have an open date (Nov. 23), before playing at Fresno State (Sept. 30). Colorado State, after five weeks, returns home to open Mountain West Conference play Oct. 7, playing host to UNLV in the school's annual Homecoming/Family Weekend game.

TIME OF DAY

New NCAA clock management rules figure to have an impact on the length of each game. Colorado State's opening game with Weber State was played in two hours, 48 minutes, 15 minutes quicker than CSU's shortest game in terms of elapsed time - 3:03 - at BYU in 2005.

FEWER PLAYS

The new timing rules also impacted the number of offensive plays run in the first game of the season. In 2005, CSU (69) and its opponents (68) combined to run an average of 137 plays per game. In CSU's first game of the season, the Rams (61) and Weber State (48) combined to run 109 plays, 28 fewer than the average in the 2005 season.

EXPLOSIVES

Colorado State had four rushing players 10 yards or more in last week's opening-game win against Weber State, including a team-best 35-yarder by Nnamdi Ohaeri. The Rams also had five pass plays - all involving QB Caleb Hanie - to three receivers that covered 20 or more yards. The longest pass play by the Rams in the opener was a 27-yard play from Hanie to HB Kory Sperry.

HALL OF FAME NOV. 3

Five new members will join Colorado State's sports hall of fame during induction ceremonies Nov. 3 at the Hilton of Fort Collins. Bryan Berryhill (track and field), Ivan Dykeman (track and field), Floyd Kerr (men's basketball), Angelo Knopf (volleyball), and Mark Mullaney form the class of 2006. The quintet will be honored at a banquet that begins at 5:30 p.m., then recognized at the Rams' football game Nov. 4 against BYU. For banquet information, call 970-491-5067.

STADIUM FACTS

Since Sonny Lubick's arrival in 1993, Colorado State has won nearly 75 percent of the team's home games. Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium has been the site to some of the greatest games in school history, and national and regional television broadcasts take place at nearly every home game.

The stadium lies at the base of the foothills of the Rocky Mountains, about two miles west of the main campus area and in one of the most scenic settings to be found anywhere. In 2000, permanent lighting standards were installed, then 4,400 additional permanent seats were constructed into the north end zone for the beginning of the 2004 season.

SONNY LUBICK **HEAD COACH** **14th Season • Western Montana '60**

Sonny Lubick has established a new standard for greatness during 13 seasons as Colorado State's head football coach.

Since taking over a program that had won just 47 games in 11 seasons with just one bowl appearance prior to his arrival in 1993, Lubick has guided the Rams' program to elite status nationally.

For example:

- Colorado State has won or shared six conference titles since 1994, more than any other Mountain West Conference member over that period;
- CSU has played in nine bowl games, more than any other league institution since 1994;
- The Rams rank among the top 20 teams in the nation in total victories since 1997;
- Lubick ranks among the top 20 NCAA Division IA active coaches in career wins;
- Colorado State has won more MWC games than any other conference team;
- The Rams have seven times since Lubick's arrival won eight or more games in a season. Four times – the only four times in school history – CSU has won 10 or more games under Lubick's watchful eye.

Lubick has ushered in by far the most successful era in the history of CSU football. His fingerprint can be seen on the results on the field as well as at the turnstile.

Not only have the Rams been perennial postseason competitors, but nine of the top 10 seasons in total attendance in school history have come during his reign. Additionally, eight of the 10 largest single game crowds in CSU history have come since his arrival.

Lubick also joined another elite list of coaches including Joe Paterno, Bobby Bowden, and Frank Beamer, in 2005 as active Division IA coaches with 100 or more career wins at their current institutions. The group includes only nine members, of which Lubick is now a member.

Interest and support of CSU's program has never been greater. The 2005 season marked the completion of an 18-month project to renovate and expand Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium. The project was made possible through a \$15.2 million gift by the Bohemian Foundation, with a caveat the stadium's playing surface be named in Lubick's honor.

The project included the installation of 4,400 new seats, the renovation of the press box and club seating area, and the addition of 12 luxury suites – each of which were sold prior to the beginning of the 2005 season.

The success enjoyed by the Rams' program under Lubick's watch has touched the entire department.

For instance, during his tenure, the department has been able to:

- Renovate and expand the stadium (\$15.2 million)
- Acquire a \$200,000 gift from former CSU all-star and current NFL All-Pro linebacker Joey Porter, who played for Lubick in the 1990's;
- Secure funding and build the McGraw Athletic Center (\$5.5 million), completed in 1999, which houses offices for every athletic department staff member, includes an academic support center, athletic marketing, promotions, and ticket offices, and breakout rooms for football position meetings, as well as a 125-seat auditorium for team meetings and special functions;

- Renovate Moby Arena (\$4.5 million in 1998 as part of the McGraw Center project.

Those projects alone total more than \$25 million, made possible in large part by the success CSU's football program has enjoyed since Lubick's arrival.

Lubick cares deeply about the people around him, particularly the program's student-athletes and his staff members. He has carefully built CSU's programs into one of the nation's best using a time-tested philosophy:

- **Responsibility:** Each member of the Rams' program is responsible for their actions and the impact on the success of the team.
- **Character:** Lubick places a premium on student-athletes who display integrity and honesty.
- **Respect:** Earning respect among peers, fans, and colleagues remains more important to the veteran coach than gaining popularity from those groups.
- **Perspective:** Remain on an even keel, win or lose. Lubick has those in the program focused on the goal ahead.

Lubick's impact has been felt not only in the football program or athletics department, but across the university and throughout the community:

- He was named the SPORTS ILLUSTRATED coach of the year in 1994 after leading CSU to a 10-2 record, conference title and berth in the Holiday Bowl;
- In 2003, Lubick was named one of four national finalists for the Eddie Robinson Coach of Distinction Award for his community service work;
- Also in 2003, the Rams' coach was recognized by the American Diabetes Association-Colorado Chapter as "Father of the Year."
- He is an annual contributor and participant in several local and national charities including the St. Jude's Children's Hospital campaign;
- In May of 2005, he was named Citizen of the Year by the Fort Collins Board of Realtors.

Lubick remains staunch in his belief a family approach is one of the reasons for Colorado State's success during his tenure.

Five of his current coaching staff members – Karl Ballard, Tom Ehlers, Darrell Funk, Dan Hammerschmidt, and his son, Marc – either played or coached under Lubick during his first stint in Fort Collins or his return beginning in 1993.

Marc joined the staff in 2005 after being on the staff of the St. Louis Rams. He replaced his older brother, Matt, who departed for a position at the University of Mississippi.

Assistants Mick Delaney and Dave Arnold both coached alongside Lubick at Montana State. Steve Stanard and James Ward had previous ties to long-time Lubick colleagues, while Jessie Williams was on the same coaching staff as Matt Lubick.

The existence of the family feeling can be seen throughout the program. For instance, 10 sets of brothers are or formerly have played for Lubick and his staff at Colorado State, a testament to the way a student-athlete is treated in the program.

Further testament to his belief in a family atmosphere takes place after every home game. After conducting his postgame news conference and greeting wife Carol Jo, Lubick is always embraced by his two young grandsons – Matthew and William – sons of his daughter, Michelle, and son-in-law Gerard Boyle.

Lubick's smile while embracing his two youngest Rams fans reflects the same happiness CSU supporters have come to appreciate during the most successful era in school history.
