MEDIA GUIDELINES

- Student-athletes are available Monday through Wednesday for interviews.
- All interviews must be coordinated through director for media relations Gary Ozzello or assistant Mike Lefler.
- Interviews are prohibited from conflicting with classes, practice sessions, meetings or medical treatment.
- On-site interviews must take place at the conclusion of practice near the locker room entrance.
- Home telephone numbers for student-athletes will not be released to the media.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted on the practice fields, in the locker room, or training room.
- Interviews with student-athletes the day before a game are restricted to network television for use during a game telecast.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted the day of a game.
- Media members are prohibited from interviewing student-athletes on the sidelines during all practices, including injured student-athletes not participating in a practice session.
- Coach Lubick is available for radio and newspaper interviews each Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 11-11:30 a.m. All requests should be forwarded to athletic media relations director Gary Ozzello at least 24 hours in advance of a requested interview.

POSTGAME PROCEDURES

- All players must report immediately to the locker room area before conducting interviews of any kind.
- Coach Sonny Lubick will meet with the media in a designated interview area at the conclusion of a 10-minute cooling period. When his remarks have concluded, he will then appear on a live network radio show, and the team locker room is open to the media.

BRONZE BOOT INFORMATION

The winner of Saturday's game earns possession of the Bronze Boot trophy, initiated in 1968 by ROTC detachments of both schools. The Bronze Boot was worn in combat in Vietnam by a CSU graduate. The day before the game, CSU's ROTC unit will run the game ball to the state border in one-mile intervals by participants. Wyoming's ROTC unit takes the ball at the border, and runs it to the stadium for presentation to the game officials before kickoff. CSU's detachment will depart from Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium Friday at 6:30 a.m. with the game ball, and will meet Wyoming's group at the border at 1 p.m.

SERIES RESULTS

Colorado State and Wyoming meet for the 98th time Saturday in both school's history. CSU leads the overall series, 53-39-5, and 6-1 in Mountain West Conference play. CSU has a 22-20-4 series edge in Laramie.

LAST MEETING

CSU QB Justin Holland threw for a career-most 419 yards and the Rams forced five turnovers in defeating Wyoming, 39-31 in Fort Collins in 2005 before 32,801 fans at Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium. Runningback Kyle Bell gained 123 yards on 35 carries behind the play of Holland. CB Darryl Williams scored CSU's first touchdown on a 27-yard interception return.

TROPHY GAMES

Colorado State competes for three different traveling trophies each year, including this week's game for the Bronze Boot with Wyoming. The winner of the CSU-Colorado game earns possession of the Centennial Cup, and the winner of CSU's annual game with Air Force gains possession of the Ram-Falcon Trophy.

33 STARTERS

Thirty-three CSU players have started at least one game in 2006, including 11 each on offense and defense and two kickers.

INJURED STARTERS

To date, CSU players have missed a total of 28 combined games played. Of that total, 20 games missed have been by starters, not including those players listed as doubtful or questionable for this week's game.

CHANGING FACES

Only one offensive lineman - OT Clint Oldenburg - has started all six games to date. The five opening-day starters played only one game together. A total of eight players have started along the offensive line thus far in 2006. Colorado State has used four different starting interior line combination in six games.

TRUE FROSH

Colorado State used a total of three true freshman in 2005, and six during the 2004 season. To date, CSU has yet to use a true freshman in the 2006 lineup.

DRIVE TIME

Colorado State has had 10 drives of 10 or more plays in 2006, and scored touchdowns on five of those drives.

BY COMPARISON

Through six games in 2006 Colorado State is allowing opponents 267.2 yards per game, second best in the MWC and 15th nationally. By comparison, through six games in 2005, the Rams were allowing 430.7 yards per game, ninth in the league and 99th nationally.

HANIE HURLER

For the second time in 2006, QB Caleb Hanie completed more than 80 percent of his passes in a game. Hanie completed 23-of-28 passes (82 percent) in the win over UNLV, the third highest figure in school history. Hanie set the school record earlier this season in a win over Colorado when he completed 20-of-23 passes (87 percent). Hanie's 23 completions in the win over UNLV is a career high.

HANIE FIRST START

Rams' QB Caleb Hanie made his first career start in 2004 against Wyoming. Hanie had replaced an injured Justin Holland the week before during CSU's 21-17 win at San Diego State. A week later, Hanie debuted as the CSU starter in CSU's 30-7 Border War win in Fort Collins. He completed 11-of-22 passes for 167 yards.

FIRST QUARTER SUCCESS

Three times in six games, CSU and its opponent have concluded the first quarter with the game tied. CSU is 3-0 in those three games.

OCTOBERFEST

Colorado State, including the win over UNLV, is now 42-15 in Sonny Lubick's 14 seasons during the month of October.

KAYLOR LEADS LEAGUE

CSU P Jimmie Kaylor, a first-team all-conference choice in 2005, currently leads the MWC in punting with a 45.8 yard average. He is fourth nationally. Kaylor is listed on the Ray Guy Award watch list.

KAYLOR ON CAREER LIST

P Jimmie Kaylor currently is atop the school's list for career punting average. In 2005 he led the MWC and ranked fourth nationally in punting average, 45.3. Kaylor has 16 career punts of 50 yards or longer, and five longer than 60 yards. He has also had 20 career punts downed inside the opponent's 20-yard line. In his career, Kaylor has punted 83 times for 3,763 yards, a 45.3 yard average. Nine times in his career he has averaged 45 yards or more per punt in a game.

NATIVE STATE

Four Colorado State players hail from the state of Wyoming. OT Clint Oldenburg (Gillette) is a three-year starter; OT Dane Stratton (Cheyenne) has played extensively in 2006, as has DE Bob Vomhof (Gillette), who has been a part-time starter. S Ben Stratton, a senior (Cheyenne) has been hampered recently by a neck injury. Stratton has been a starter throughout his four-year career, including twice in 2006.

SUDDEN CHANGE

Colorado State has made 10 turnovers in six games. Following those 10 turnovers, CSU has allowed just 16 points (three field goals, one touchdown and point-after). CSU has generated seven takeaways, and scored 24 points (three touchdowns and ensuing point-after, one field goal) following the turnovers.

SACK EXCHANGE

Colorado State enters Saturday's game with 16 quarterback sacks through six games, just three shy of the team's season total, 19, in 2005. The top two season figures in school history, 34 in each, were in 1994 and '97.

NONE PAST TWO

After garnering 16 sacks the first four games of the season, Colorado State has been sackless the past two contests.

SAFETY SACKS

S Mike Pagnotta has three sacks on the season to lead the Rams. The last Ram defensive back with four sacks in a season was former S John Howell in 1999. Howell later played on two Super Bowl teams in the NFL with Tampa Bay and Seattle.

RUSHING LEADER

RB Gartrell Johnson has led the team in rushing four times in six games. Johnson gained a season and career-most 75 yards in CSU's game with Air Force, the third consecutive contest he has established a new career high..

SPECIAL TEAMS STREAKS

The Rams have returned 207 kickoffs without a touchdown since Sept. 29, 2001 when Dexter Wynn scored on a kickoff return at Wyoming.

FIRST-TIME STARTERS

Twelve Colorado State players have made their first career starts in 2006, including OT Dane Stratton and S Jake Galusha. Both appeared in the opening-play lineup for the first times in their respective careers.

RECEIVING BREAKDOWN

WR Johnny Walker has been QB Caleb Hanie's favorite target in 2006, with 40 passes thrown his way. He leads the team with 34 receptions, and has caught 85 percent of the passes thrown his way. CSU's reception percentage list includes:

HANIE ON TARGET

QB Caleb Hanie has established himself as one of the most accurate passers in school history. Through six games, Hanie has completed 101-of-144 passes for 1,345 yards and seven touchdowns. He has completed 70.1 percent of his passes. Already twice this season, Hanie has completed more than 80 percent of his passes in a game, including a school-record 87 percent (20-of-23) in the Rams' win over Colorado. He connected on his first 14 attempts in that game. Earlier this season, he also completed 82.1 percent of his attempts (23-of-28) against UNLV, including his first nine in a row. 1,000-YARD RECEIVERS

WR Dustin Osborn became the 18th player in school history with more than 1,000 career receiving yards during CSU's game with Air Force. Osborn has 59 career receptions for 1,008 yards and 10 touchdowns, his most recent coming on a 60-yard toss from QB Caleb Hanie against AFA. Teammate Kory Sperry is close to reaching the plateau, with 71 career receptions for 943 yards and nine touchdowns.

SAFETY TACKLES

S Clint Kubiak had a career-most 19 tackles in CSU's game with Air Force, the most this season by any player on the roster, and most since S Miles Kochevar had 16 tackles against Navy in the Poinsettia Bowl to conclude the 2005 season.

EXPLOSIVES

Through six games, Colorado State has 39 "explosive" plays, including:

- 19 rushes (10 or more yards), including 10 in the past three games.
- 20 pass plays (20 or more yards), including three at Air Force..

OPENING DRIVES

Colorado State since 1993 is **35-11** in games the Rams have scored on the opening drive of the game. CSU is **17-28** in games the opponent has scored on the opening drive.

FIRST SCORES

Colorado State is **70-15** since 1993 when the Rams score first in a game. The Rams are **34-40** since 1993 when the opponent scores first.

LOST INTERCEPTIONS

Colorado State has a 4-2 record entering Saturday's game in Laramie. In both losses, the Rams were victimized by two interceptions. QB Caleb Hanie has thrown a total of five interceptions in six games, but four have come in the team's two losses.

DIALING FOR DISTANCE

WR Damon Morton is second on the team with 23 receptions, but leads Colorado State with 417 receiving yards. Morton averages 18.1 yards per reception. He gained 83 yards on a reception from QB Caleb Hanie against Air Force. Morton is averaging 3.8 receptions per game, but leads the team with 69.5 receiving yards per game.

RUSHING DEFENSE

Colorado State has allowed **71** individual 100-yard rushing performances since 1993. The Rams are **35-30** in games where an opponent rusher has gained 100 or more yards and **62-24** when an opponent does not have a 100-yard rusher.

100-YARD RUSHERS

STADIUM FACTS

Since Sonny Lubick's arrival in 1993, Colorado State has won nearly 75 percent of the team's home games. Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium has been the site to some of the greatest games in school history, and national and regional television broadcasts take place at nearly every home game.

The stadium lies at the base of the foothills of the Rocky Mountains, about two miles west of the main campus area and in one of the most scenic settings to be found anywhere. In 2000, permanent lighting standards were installed, then 4,400 additional permanent seats were constructed into the north end zone for the beginning of the 2004 season.

SONNY LUBICK **HEAD COACH** **14th Season • Western Montana '60**

Sonny Lubick has established a new standard for greatness during 13 seasons as Colorado State's head football coach.

Since taking over a program that had won just 47 games in 11 seasons with just one bowl appearance prior to his arrival in 1993, Lubick has guided the Rams' program to elite status nationally.

For example:

- Colorado State has won or shared six conference titles since 1994, more than any other Mountain West Conference member over that period;
- CSU has played in nine bowl games, more than any other league institution since 1994;
- The Rams rank among the top 20 teams in the nation in total victories since 1997;
- Lubick ranks among the top 20 NCAA Division IA active coaches in career wins;
- Colorado State has won more MWC games than any other conference team;
- The Rams have seven times since Lubick's arrival won eight or more games in a season. Four times – the only four times in school history – CSU has won 10 or more games under Lubick's watchful eye.

Lubick has ushered in by far the most successful era in the history of CSU football. His fingerprint can be seen on the results on the field as well as at the turnstile.

Not only have the Rams been perennial postseason competitors, but nine of the top 10 seasons in total attendance in school history have come during his reign. Additionally, eight of the 10 largest single game crowds in CSU history have come since his arrival.

Lubick also joined another elite list of coaches including Joe Paterno, Bobby Bowden, and Frank Beamer, in 2005 as active Division IA coaches with 100 or more career wins at their current institutions. The group includes only nine members, of which Lubick is now a member.

Interest and support of CSU's program has never been greater. The 2005 season marked the completion of an 18-month project to renovate and expand Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium. The project was made possible through a \$15.2 million gift by the Bohemian Foundation, with a caveat the stadium's playing surface be named in Lubick's honor.

The project included the installation of 4,400 new seats, the renovation of the press box and club seating area, and the addition of 12 luxury suites – each of which were sold prior to the beginning of the 2005 season.

The success enjoyed by the Rams' program under Lubick's watch has touched the entire department.

For instance, during his tenure, the department has been able to:

- Renovate and expand the stadium (\$15.2 million)
- Acquire a \$200,000 gift from former CSU all-star and current NFL All-Pro linebacker Joey Porter, who played for Lubick in the 1990's;
- Secure funding and build the McGraw Athletic Center (\$5.5 million), completed in 1999, which houses offices for every athletic department staff member, includes an academic support center, athletic marketing, promotions, and ticket offices, and breakout rooms for football position meetings, as well as a 125-seat auditorium for team meetings and special functions;

- Renovate Moby Arena (\$4.5 million in 1998 as part of the McGraw Center project.

Those projects alone total more than \$25 million, made possible in large part by the success CSU's football program has enjoyed since Lubick's arrival.

Lubick cares deeply about the people around him, particularly the program's student-athletes and his staff members. He has carefully built CSU's programs into one of the nation's best using a time-tested philosophy:

- **Responsibility:** Each member of the Rams' program is responsible for their actions and the impact on the success of the team.
- **Character:** Lubick places a premium on student-athletes who display integrity and honesty.
- **Respect:** Earning respect among peers, fans, and colleagues remains more important to the veteran coach than gaining popularity from those groups.
- **Perspective:** Remain on an even keel, win or lose. Lubick has those in the program focused on the goal ahead.

Lubick's impact has been felt not only in the football program or athletics department, but across the university and throughout the community:

- He was named the SPORTS ILLUSTRATED coach of the year in 1994 after leading CSU to a 10-2 record, conference title and berth in the Holiday Bowl;
- In 2003, Lubick was named one of four national finalists for the Eddie Robinson Coach of Distinction Award for his community service work;
- Also in 2003, the Rams' coach was recognized by the American Diabetes Association-Colorado Chapter as "Father of the Year."
- He is an annual contributor and participant in several local and national charities including the St. Jude's Children's Hospital campaign;
- In May of 2005, he was named Citizen of the Year by the Fort Collins Board of Realtors.

Lubick remains staunch in his belief a family approach is one of the reasons for Colorado State's success during his tenure.

Five of his current coaching staff members – Karl Ballard, Tom Ehlers, Darrell Funk, Dan Hammerschmidt, and his son, Marc – either played or coached under Lubick during his first stint in Fort Collins or his return beginning in 1993.

Marc joined the staff in 2005 after being on the staff of the St. Louis Rams. He replaced his older brother, Matt, who departed for a position at the University of Mississippi.

Assistants Mick Delaney and Dave Arnold both coached alongside Lubick at Montana State. Steve Stanard and James Ward had previous ties to long-time Lubick colleagues, while Jessie Williams was on the same coaching staff as Matt Lubick.

The existence of the family feeling can be seen throughout the program. For instance, 10 sets of brothers are or formerly have played for Lubick and his staff at Colorado State, a testament to the way a student-athlete is treated in the program.

Further testament to his belief in a family atmosphere takes place after every home game. After conducting his postgame news conference and greeting wife Carol Jo, Lubick is always embraced by his two young grandsons – Matthew and William – sons of his daughter, Michelle, and son-in-law Gerard Boyle.

Lubick's smile while embracing his two youngest Rams fans reflects the same happiness CSU supporters have come to appreciate during the most successful era in school history.
