MEDIA GUIDELINES

- Home and/or cell phone numbers will not be provided to the media. Media are asked not to request an individual's personal contact information, including e-mail, but rather to contact media relations. Media are restricted from using public directories to contact and interview coaches and/or student-athletes.
- On-site interviews must take place at the conclusion of practice near the locker room entrance to Moby Arena.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted on the practice fields, in the locker room, or training room.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted the day of a game.
- Telephone interviews with a member of the coaching staff should be arranged at least 24 hours in advance of the requested session.
- Coach Lubick is available for interviews each Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 11-11:30 a.m. All requests should be forwarded to media relations director Zak Gilbert at least 24 hours in advance.

POSTGAME PROCEDURES

- All players must report immediately to the locker room area before conducting interviews of any kind.

THIS WEEK'S NOTABLE STORYLINES

Colorado State, like Rocky Balboa, continues to get knocked down but refuses to quit...The Rams, in the midst of one of their most difficult stretches in program history, valiantly continue the search for their first win since Oct. 7, 2006.

RAM-FALCON TROPHY UP FOR GRABS

Colorado State has three Front Range rivalries that are celebrated annually with "Trophy Games." All of the traveling trophies are presented to the victorious coach following each year's game.

This week, the Ram-Falcon Trophy goes to the victor. Originated in 1980 to highlight the competition and sportsmanship in the series between Colorado State and Air Force, the wood-carved trophy was produced by local artist Bill Wrage. The Air Force ROTC detachment on the CSU campus initiated the creation of the trophy, which is held in possession of the winning program following the game each year until the following contest.

The Ram-Falcon Trophy is displayed on the sidelines of the stadium of the team in possession of the award from the previous season. To date, the Ram-Falcon series is tied, 13-13.

The Bronze Boot symbolizes Colorado State's series with Wyoming. It was established in 1968 by ROTC detachments at both schools. It is a bronzed combat boot originally worn in Vietnam by Dan Romero, a graduate of Colorado State. Since its inception, Wyoming has a 19-15 advantage in Bronze Boot games.

The Centennial Cup signifies the rivalry between the state's two largest public institutions, Colorado State and the University of Colorado, which narrowly returned to Boulder earlier this year following the Buffs' 31-28 overtime win.

CONFERENCE LEADERS STILL ON SCHEDULE

If there is a silver lining in the Rams' 0-5 start, it might be that three of the teams who currently lead the conference -- BYU, Wyoming and this week's foe, Air Force -- have yet to play CSU.

Whether the Rams can compete for more than their pride remains to be seen, although as Sonny Lubick said following Saturday's loss to San Diego State, the team really can't lose the rest of the season.

And, despite the winless start, and a 12-game losing stretch that began with last season's Air Force contest in Colorado Springs, don't question the Rams' mentality. The team somehow refuses to give up, and continues to play with as much confidence as any team in the conference with a better record.

OCTOBER HOMECOMING

Last Saturday's Homecoming contest was a welcome respite for a road-weary team that had played three of its first four away from Fort Collins. This month kicks off a stretch in which the Rams play three of their four (and five of their eight remaining regular-season clashes) at Hughes Stadium.

TAKEAWAY WEDNESDAY

The past two weeks, the Rams' defensive coaches have initiated "Takeaway Wednesday" at practice. The defensive unit (line, linebackers or secondary) with the most takeaways at practice that afternoon is treated to a home-made dessert, crafted by the coaches' wives, the following day.

The victorious unit has been treated to banana pudding and peach cobbler, among other treats.

Prior to the Houston game, coaches initiated Takeaway Wednesday in order to motivate players into creating turnovers. And, since that practice, the Rams have five takeaways over the three-game stretch.

LUBICKS TO WELCOME CAMPERS

Last summer, Head Coach Sonny Lubick and his son, Marc, the Rams' wide receivers coach, were guest speakers at the Sky High Hope Camp, a getaway for youths battling various forms of cancer.

This week, the head coach is providing tickets to 40 of those campers, who also will join the Rams in the locker room following the game. Marc Lubick successfully overcame a rare form of cancer in 2006, and continues to have checkups to monitor his condition.

The Sky High Hope Camp is held at Buckhorn Camp near Bellvue, Colo., west of Fort Collins. Its mission is to give children who have or have had cancer, and their siblings, an opportunity to enjoy an outdoor camp experience in an environment that is safe, supportive and fun.

Its staff members are a widely diverse group of caring individuals. Each staff member brings something special to camp. Many of its volunteer staff returns to camp year after year.

For seven days, 24 hours a day, the staff takes on a number of roles to create the wonderful experience it calls Sky High Hope Camp. It has unit staff and unit leaders, activity specialists, doctors and nurses. Each staff position is important and makes camp a great place to be.

Children at camp have or have had cancer in their lives. Campers may be at different stages of the cancer experience or a sibling who has dealt with the same issues.

Activities offered at camp are designed to help the participants make new friends, feel part of a group and learn or improve skills and interests. Activities include: archery, nature study, arts & crafts, computers, water activities, horseback riding, hiking and backpacking. Each session is planned around a theme that carries them through the week.

AIR FORCE ACADEMY, Colo. (AP) - Shaun Carney led Air Force on three second-half touchdown drives, and the Falcons overcame an 83-yard pass play just before halftime to beat Colorado State 24-21 on a Thursday night.

The Falcons (3-2, 3-0 Mountain West) ended a seven-game losing streak on Thursday nights. Five of those losses came at the hands of the Rams (4-2, 1-1), who dominated the first half but gained just 72 yards in the second half.

Damon Morton's 83-yard reception from Caleb Hanie set up a touchdown just before halftime that gave Colorado State a seemingly commanding 21-3 lead. The big play ended up emboldening the Falcons.

After Falcons fullback Jacobe Kendrick scored on a 6-yard run, Air Force safety Bobby Giannini picked off Hanie's pass at the CSU 14, and from there, Carney hit a sliding Spencer Armstrong to cut the Rams' lead to 21-17 with 2:15 left in the third quarter.

Carney's 19-yard pass to Victor Thompson with 11:20 left gave the Falcons their first lead at 24-21.

The Rams got the ball back with 4:07 remaining, and were backed up, facing second-and-20 from their own 10-yard line when Falcons linebacker Joey Keller drew a personal foul for a late hit on Hanie, giving CSU a first down at the 25.

But Hanie's deep pass intended for Dustin Osborn deep was intercepted by Air Force cornerback Chris Sutton at the Falcons' 17 with 1:59 left.

POSTGAME NOTES FROM SDSU

- For the second time this year, the Rams lost a heartbreaker after leading into the fourth quarter. CSU also dropped such a contest vs. Colorado (Sept. 1), in overtime. And, at Houston (Sept. 22), the Rams lost after taking a tie into the final period. In Sonny Lubick's 15 seasons at CSU, the Rams have lost only nine games when leading after three quarters. Two of those are in the first five games of 2007.
- The Rams generated seven sacks as a team, their most since Sept. 2, 2006, vs. Weber State. On that afternoon, CSU also posted seven sacks.
- The Rams are enduring their worst start since 1988, when they opened 0-6 before finishing 1-10 in the final season of the Leon Fuller era. That year, CSU was outscored by an average of 12.8 points over its first five games (157-93). This season, opponents have outscored the Rams by just 5.2 points per contest (141-115).
- DT Blake Smith totaled 2½ sacks on the day, a career best and single-game season high for the Rams. Previously, his most was two against Wyoming in 2004 as a freshman. The team's 2007 season high had been Matt Rupp's 1½ at Houston (Sept. 22). Smith also posted a career-best seven tackles.
- K Jason Smith remained the only primary kicker in the Mountain West yet to miss a field goal or extra point.
- LB Ricky Brewer made his first collegiate start.
- S Zac Bryson registered a career-best nine tackles.

SMITH HASN'T MISSED

Through four games, CSU's Jason Smith is the most accurate kicker in the MWC, the only one who has yet to miss a field goal or PAT. At Houston (Sept. 22), he nailed both field goals, including a clutch, 31-yard kick that put CSU up 27-24 with only 9:20 left in the game. At TCU (Sept. 29), Smith hit two more FGs, including a 47-yarder, the second-longest of his career.

HUMBLE RAMS

Following the Sept. 1 season opener, the school received a handful of questions regarding the team's 2007 game jerseys, which do not include names on the back. Head Coach Sonny Lubick said the senior class opted for the move, as a mark of team unity, primarily because it cared more about the name on the front of the uniform than the name on the back. Several schools also do not include sir names, including Southern California, Penn State and Oklahoma.

WIRE-TO-WIRE WINS

- Of CSU's 105 wins under Sonny Lubick, 56 have been in games in which the Rams never trailed.

SPECIAL TEAMS STREAKS

- The Rams have returned 248 kickoffs without a touchdown, since Sept. 29, 2001, when Dexter Wynn scored on a kickoff return at Wyoming.

LONE STAR STARTER

QB Caleb Hanie is the first Texan to open a season at quarterback under Rams' coach Sonny Lubick. Since 1993, the Rams have boasted a trio of Coloradans (Justin Holland 2004-05; Matt Newton 1999-2000; Ryan Eslinger 1998) and two Californians (D.J. Busch 2001; Moses Moreno 1995) to open the year. No Texan has been the team's opening-game starter in the past 50 seasons.

RAMS TIME LINE

- 1892 A group of students form an athletic association and hold the first annual Field Day competition involving track and field events.
- 1893 The school fields its first intercollegiate football team, losing to Longmont Academy, 12-8 in its first game.
- 1911 Harry Hughes begins at 31-year career as the football coach, and wins 125 games and eight conference titles in his career.
- 1913 The first school mascot is Peanuts, an English Bulldog.
- 1936 Glenn Morris, '34, wins a gold medal in the decathlon in the Berlin Olympics. Morris was an all-conference football, basketball, and track performer.
- 1946 "CAM," a Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep, is the new mascot.
- 1948 Thurman "Fum" McGraw becomes the school's first consensus football All-American.
- 1949 The football team plays its first bowl game, losing to Occidental in the Raisin Bowl. McGraw is again named All-American.
- 1957 The nickname changes from Aggies to Rams.
- 1966 Moby Arena opens.
- 1968 Hughes Stadium opens.
- 1969 CSU's men's basketball team advances to the Final Eight in the NCAA Tournament.
- 1970 Alumnus Jack Christiansen is inducted into the NFL Hall of Fame.
- 1984 Sherri Danielson becomes CSU's first volleyball All-American.
- 1989 Alumnus Boyd Grant coaches the Rams to the conference title and NCAA Tournament.
- 1990 CSU defeats Oregon in the Freedom Bowl, its first bowl appearance since 1949.
- 1994 Sonny Lubick guides the football team to the conference title and a berth in the Holiday Bowl.
- 1995 CSU repeats as conference football champion.
- 1996 Swimmer Amy Van Dyken wins four gold medals in the Atlanta Olympics.
- 1997 CSU is 11-2 in football and defeats Missouri in the Holiday Bowl to finish the season ranked 14th nationally.
- 1999 CSU wins the first-ever Mountain West Conference championship and plays in the Liberty Bowl.
- 2000 CSU beats Louisville in the Liberty Bowl and finishes ranked among the Top 20.
- 2003 A \$15.2 million gift by the Bohemian Foundation spurs renovation and expansion of the newly named Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium.

IN THE BACKYARD

- CSU has had a primary focus on recruiting in-state players during Sonny Lubick's tenure.

- In 2005, he rushed for 1,288 yards and scored 10 touchdowns, second in the Mountain West Conference and 22nd nationally.
- Bell suffered a right knee injury days before the 2006 season-opener, requiring surgical repair, but has made a full recovery.
- A junior entering '06, Bell used his redshirt last season and has two years of eligibility remaining.
- Including Sept. 8, Bell now has eight career 100-yard rushing games (six in 2005).
- Bell fumbled only twice on 276 carries in '05.
- Bell was named first-team academic all-district and second-team academic All-American in '05.

- 24 Bill Green (men's basketball)**
 Green was the school's first consensus All-American in 1962 and '63 in men's basketball and later an award-winning educator in New York City.
- 25 Becky Hammon (women's basketball)**
 Hammon led Colorado State to a top-five national ranking and Elite Eight berth in the NCAA Tournament. She was also a first-team All-American.
- 48 Thurman "Fum" McGraw (football)**
 Fum McGraw is the most recognized athlete in school history. He was the first player to earn consensus All-American honors in football in 1948 and '49, and later played professionally for the Detroit Lions. McGraw was also a coach and athletic administrator at his alma mater. He was the school's director of athletics from 1976-86.

STADIUM FACTS

Since Sonny Lubick's arrival in 1993, Colorado State has won nearly 75 percent of its home games. Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium has been the site to some of the greatest games in school history, and national and regional television broadcasts take place at nearly every home game.

The stadium lies at the base of the foothills of the Rocky Mountains, about two miles west of the main campus, and in one of the most scenic college football settings anywhere. In 2000, permanent lighting standards were installed, then 4,400 additional permanent seats were constructed in the north end zone prior to the 2004 season.

SONNY LUBICK • HEAD COACH

15th Season • Western Montana '60

Colorado State's football program has attained previously unknown heights during head coach Sonny Lubick's 15 seasons. During that time, Lubick has created a standard for excellence never before evident during the more than 100-year history of the football program.

Since taking over a program that had won just 47 games in 11 seasons with just one bowl appearance prior to his arrival in 1993, Lubick has guided the Rams' program to elite status nationally.

For example:

- Colorado State has won or shared six conference titles since 1994, more than any other Mountain West Conference member over that period;
- CSU has played in nine bowl games, more than any other league institution since 1994;
- The Rams rank among the top 20 teams in the nation in total victories since 1997;
- Lubick ranks among the top 20 NCAA Division I FBS active coaches in career wins;
- Colorado State is among the leaders in MWC victories since the conference came into being in 1999.
- The Rams have seven times since Lubick's arrival won eight or more games in a season. Four times – the only four times in school history – CSU has won 10 or more games under Lubick's watchful eye.

Lubick has ushered in by far the most successful era in the history of CSU football. His fingerprint can be seen on the results on the field as well as at the turnstile.

Not only have the Rams been perennial postseason competitors, but nine of the top 10 seasons in total attendance in school history have come during his reign. Additionally, eight of the 10 largest single-game crowds in CSU history have come since his arrival.

Lubick also joined another elite list of coaches including Joe Paterno, Bobby Bowden, and Frank Beamer, in 2005 as active Division IA coaches with 100 or more career wins at their current institutions. The group includes only nine members, of which Lubick is now a member.

Interest and support of CSU's program has never been greater. The 2006 season marked the completion of an 18-month project to renovate and expand Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium. The project was made possible through a \$15.2 million gift by the Bohemian Foundation, with a caveat the stadium's playing surface be named in Lubick's honor.

The project included the installation of 4,400 new seats, the renovation of the press box and club seating area, and the addition of 12 luxury suites – each of which were sold prior to the beginning of the 2005 season.

Prior to the 2006 season, a new artificial playing surface was installed to complete the renovation.

The success enjoyed by the Rams' program under Lubick's watch has touched the entire department.

For instance, during his tenure, CSU has been able to:

- Renovate and expand the stadium (\$15.2 million)
- Acquire a \$200,000 gift from former CSU all-star and current NFL All-Pro linebacker Joey Porter, who played for Lubick in the 1990's and a gift of \$75,000 from former defensive end and 10-year NFL veteran Brady Smith for program enhancements.
- Secure funding and build the McGraw Athletic Center (\$5.5 million), completed in 1999, which houses offices for every athletic department staff member, includes an academic support center,

athletic marketing, promotions, and ticket offices, and breakout rooms for football position meetings, as well as a 125-seat auditorium for team meetings and special functions;

- Renovate Moby Arena (\$4.5) million in 1998 as part of the McGraw Center project.

Those projects alone total more than \$25 million, made possible in large part by the success CSU's football program has enjoyed since Lubick's arrival.

Lubick cares deeply about the people around him, particularly the program's student-athletes and his staff members. He has carefully built CSU's programs into one of the nation's best using a time-tested philosophy:

- Responsibility: Each member of the Rams' program is responsible for their actions and the impact on the success of the team.
- Character: Lubick places a premium on student-athletes who display integrity and honesty.
- Respect: Earning respect among peers, fans, and colleagues remains more important to the veteran coach than gaining popularity from those groups.
- Perspective: Remain on an even keel, win or lose. Lubick has those in the program focused on the goal ahead.

Lubick's impact has been felt not only in the football program or athletics department, but across the university and throughout the community:

- He was named the *SPORTS ILLUSTRATED* coach of the year in 1994 after leading CSU to a 10-2 record;
- In 2003, Lubick was named one of four national finalists for the Eddie Robinson Coach of Distinction Award for his community service work;
- Also in 2003, the Rams' coach was recognized by the American Diabetes Association-Colorado Chapter as "Father of the Year."
- He is an annual contributor and participant in several local and national charities including St. Jude's Children's Hospital;• In May of 2005, he was named Citizen of the Year by the Fort Collins Board of Realtors;
- Lubick and his family were honored by a local charitable organization in the winter of 2006 for their commitment and dedication to the northern Colorado community;
- In January of 2007, Lubick was named the Collins Award winner, given annually to a local figure that exemplifies leadership and service to the Fort Collins Community by the local chamber of commerce.

Lubick remains staunch in his belief a family approach is one of the reasons for Colorado State's success during his tenure.

Five of his current coaching staff members – Karl Ballard, Tom Ehlers, Darrell Funk, Dan Hammerschmidt, and his son, Marc – either played or coached under Lubick during his first stint in Fort Collins or his return beginning in 1993.

Marc joined the staff in 2005 after being on the staff of the St. Louis Rams. He replaced his older brother, Matt, who departed for a position at the University of Mississippi.

Assistants Mick Delaney and Dave Arnold both coached alongside Lubick at Montana State. Steve Stanard and James Ward had previous ties to long-time Lubick colleagues, while Jessie Williams was on the same coaching staff as Matt Lubick.

Further testament to his belief in a family atmosphere takes place after every home game. After conducting his postgame news conference and greeting wife Carol Jo, Lubick is always embraced by his three young grandchildren – Matthew, William and Emma – children of his daughter, Michelle, and son-in-law Gerard Boyle.

Lubick's smile while embracing his two youngest Rams fans reflects the same happiness CSU supporters have come to appreciate during the most successful era in school history.

DENVER, Colo. (AP) - Senior kicker Kevin Eberhart sent the game into OT with a 22-yarder with 13 seconds left. The Rams won the coin flip, but Terrence Wheatley intercepted Caleb Hanie's pass in the end zone and Eberhart hit the game-winning kick. The last five games between the rivals have been decided by 25 points, and none

by more than a touchdown. CU freshman Cody Hawkins completed 18 of 31 passes for 201 yards, two touchdowns and one interception.

Rams senior Kyle Bell returned to the backfield after missing last season with a knee injury and rushed a career-high 40 times for 135 yards and a touchdown, and Hanie (20-of-27) threw three touchdown passes to tight end Kory Sperry and wasn't picked off until his final pass of the afternoon.

The Rams (0-1) scored two quick touchdowns coming out of halftime to take a 28-17 lead.

Sperry, who caught TD strikes of 2 and 6 yards in the first half, hauled in a 37-yarder from Hanie to put the Rams ahead 21-17. He dragged defender Brad Jones the final 10 yards into the end zone to give the Rams their first lead.

Jason Smith then squibbed a line drive on the ensuing kickoff that ricocheted off R.J. Brown, who had turned his head at Smith approached the ball. Jermaine Walters recovered for the Rams and Colorado State drove 47 yards and went up 28-17 on Bell's 13-yard run.

Smith squibbed it again, but this time, Wheatley returned it 68 yards before Smith corralled him at the Rams' 21. Colorado, however, failed to score as Eberhart's 41-yard attempt sailed wide right.

Colorado put together an 86-yard drive on their next possession as Hawkins converted three third-and-long plays before Demetrius Sumler took it in from the 3. The 2-point conversion, a pass to Riar Greer, made it 28-25.

Colorado's game-tying drive was set up by Chase McBride's 43-yard punt return and a pass interference call on Rams cornerback Joey Rucks on fourth-and-4 from the Colorado State 28 with 1:16 remaining.

Keenum replaced starter Blake Joseph in the second quarter and had a hand in four touchdowns. He was 18-of-22 passing for 197 yards and two TDs and had two rushing scores.

On Colorado State's first possession, Dion Morton scored his first career touchdown on a 37-yard pass from Hanie. Later in the first quarter, John Mosure had his first career TD catch.

The Cougars forced the Rams to punt on the opening drive of the second half, and Houston scored its first touchdown just under two minutes later when Keenum, who completed his first 12 passes, hit L.J. Castille on a 30-yarder. It was Castille's first career receiving touchdown.

Starter Andy Dalton suffered an apparent knee injury on TCU's opening drive. Jackson had a 4-yard touchdown run on his first play of the game.

Jackson was 11-for-26 passing for 137 yards and carried 17 times for 38 yards.

Colorado State finished the scoring on Smith's 27-yard field goal and Caleb Hanie's 54-yard touchdown pass to Damon Morton. The two-point conversion failed, leaving the score at 24-12 a minute into the fourth quarter.

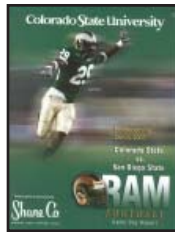

San Diego State quickly tied the game at 10 on Garrett Palmer's 33-yard field goal with 4:30 left in the third quarter. The field goal was set up by a 46-yard pass play from Darren Mougey to Vincent Brown.

But two San Diego State possessions later, Darryl Williams recovered Brandon Bornes' fumble at the Aztecs' 20. Colorado State settled for a 20-yard field goal by Smith as time expired in the third quarter, putting the Rams on top 13-10.

San Diego got the lead back when O'Connell ran through several arm tackles on a 16-yard TD run with 13:16 left in the fourth quarter.
