MEDIA GUIDELINES

The department takes these matters very seriously and violations will result in immediate revocation of credentials.
- Home and/or cell phone numbers will not be provided to the media. Media are asked not to request an individual's personal contact information, including e-mail, but rather to contact media relations. Media are restricted from using public directories to contact and interview coaches and/or student-athletes.
- On-site interviews must take place at the conclusion of practice near the locker room entrance to Moby Arena.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted on the practice fields, in the locker room, or training room.
- Interviews with student-athletes are not permitted the day of a game.
- Telephone interviews with a member of the coaching staff should be arranged at least 24 hours in advance of the requested session.
- Coach Lubick is available for interviews each Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 11-11:30 a.m. All requests should be forwarded to media relations director Zak Gilbert at least 24 hours in advance.

POSTGAME PROCEDURES

- All players must report immediately to the locker room area before conducting interviews of any kind.
- Coach Sonny Lubick will meet with the media in a designated interview area at the conclusion of a 10-minute cooling period. When his remarks have concluded, he will then appear on a live network radio show, and the team locker room is open to the media.

THIS WEEK'S NOTABLE STORYLINES

Colorado State hosts one of the most anticipated home openers in school history. The Cal Bears, possibly ranked in the Top 10 after polls are announced early this week, are only the second Pac-10 team to play CSU in Fort Collins...CSU, clearly much improved from a squad that dropped its last seven games in 2006, bids to make national headlines and register its first win since Oct. 7, 2006...The Rams upset the Bears in the schools' first meeting, four years ago.

LAST TIME AGAINST CAL

Jeff Babcock's 32-yard field goal with 1:57 in regulation sealed the Rams' unlikely 23-21 win over Cal on a sun-filled Sept. 6, 2003, in Berkeley. The Rams led most of the game, behind a stingy defense that allowed just 299 total yards and forced three turnovers. After Cal had taken a 21-20 lead, quarterback Bradlee Van Pelt engineered the game-winning drive, an 11-play, 65-yard march. Van Pelt threw for 317 yards and two scores, while rushing for 60 additional yards. H-back Joel Dreesen registered one of the TD catches, an 85-yard, first-quarter play. David Anderson caught seven passes for 141 yards and a 25-yard TD in the second half. LB Eric Pauly paced the Rams with nine tackles. Just like this season, that year the Rams also opened with an incredibly hard-fought loss to bitter rival Colorado at Denver's Invesco Field, 42-35.

THE FIRST PAC-10 TEAM IN FORT COLLINS

The first Pac-10 team to visit Hughes Stadium, Oregon, spoiled Sonny Lubick's debut as the Rams' head coach, 23-9. Ducks quarterback Danny O'Neil threw for 307 yards and two second-half TDs while dodging CSU's Steve Hodge, who collected three sacks.

HUMBLE RAMS

Following Saturday's season opener, the school received a handful of questions regarding the team's 2007 game jerseys, which do not include names on the back. Head Coach Sonny Lubick said the senior class opted for the move, as a mark of team unity, primarily because it cared more about the name on the front of the uniform than the name on the back. Several schools also do not include sir names, including Southern California, Penn State and Oklahoma.

THROWBACK JERSEYS ON TAP

Speaking of jerseys, the Rams this week will don throwback uniforms to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the school's name change from Colorado A&M to Colorado State, in 1957.

The school hopes to have several game-worn jerseys for sale in an online auction this week, on the school's official athletics Web site, CSURams.com. The jerseys would be sold this week and distributed following the game.

With the current student-athletes behind the movement, the school has been searching for ways to promote its history and traditions. Assistant athletic director/development Mike LaPlante originated the idea of throwback uniforms, and the athletic department's new Web site, scheduled to launch later this fall, is expected to have a section dedicated to history. The school has plenty of proud traditions and a rich history. Sonny Lubick began his tenure as Rams head coach in 1993, the 100th anniversary of CSU football.

In 1957, friends and foes knew the school as the Colorado A&M Aggies. Two years later, the institution changed its mascot to Rams, but the Aggie nickname is still alive and well.

The prominent white "A" displayed on the foothills overlooking the Rams' home field turns 84 years old this year. It is the oldest ongoing tradition associated with Colorado State. Presently, the "A" is 450 feet from top to bottom and 210 feet across at its base. An official landmark, the "A" is repainted each fall during Homecoming week by members of the Sigma Alpha Epsilon fraternity and incoming freshmen football players.

This week, the Rams will look similar to the Aggies of 1957, with dark green shirts trimmed in white and gold shoulder stripes. Headgear will look similar to the Alabama Crimson Tide, with green helmets that sport white uniform numbers on each side. A handful of schools have donned throwback uniforms in recent years, including the Florida Gators last season.

RAMS IN HUGHES OPENERS

That 1993 Oregon game represented a rare loss for the Rams in a Fort Collins debut. Under Sonny Lubick at their home stadium, on a field that now bears the coach's name, the Rams are 12-2 (1993-2006). CSU's only other loss in a Hughes Stadium opener was Sept. 18, 2004, a 34-16 loss to the Big Ten's Minnesota Gophers.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

The road doesn't get any smoother for the Rams, whose next three opponents were either ranked or received votes in the preseason polls. This could be the most difficult schedule CSU has played under Sonny Lubick. Cal will be the Rams' first ranked opponent since 2005, a loss at No. 20 TCU, and is expected to become the Rams' highest-ranked opponent since Urban Meyer's No. 7/8 Utah Utes in 2004.

Lubick does, however, own two impressive victories over Top 10 opponents. In 1994, his team topped No. 4/6 Arizona in Tucson, and in 2002, his Rams beat No. 7/6 Colorado.

POSTGAME NOTES FROM SATURDAY

- Junior running back **Kyle Bell** returned from a preseason knee injury that wiped out his '06 season and played his first game since the 2005 Poinsettia Bowl in San Diego, vs. Navy, Dec. 22, 2005. Bell Saturday:
- Established his career high with 40 rushing attempts. His previous best was 35 (for 123 yards), vs. Wyoming, Oct. 22, 2005.
- Piled up the most carries by a CSU player since Oct. 12, 1985, when Steve Bartalo established the school record with 47 (for 152 yards, three TDs) in a 45-28 win at New Mexico.
- Recorded the first 100-yard game by a CSU running back since that Poinsettia Bowl, vs. Navy (Dec. 22, 2005, Kyle Bell, 22-122-1).
- Became the third CSU back since 1994 to rush for 100 yards against Colorado.
- Senior tight end **Kory Sperry** tied his career high with eight receptions (vs. Navy, 2005 Poinsettia Bowl, 8-117).
- Sperry became the first CSU player with three touchdown catches since Dustin Osborn (7-102, three TDs) at Minnesota, Sept. 10, 2005.
- He also became the 10th CSU receiver since 1994 with more than 100 yards receiving against Colorado.
- Sperry moved into seventh place in the CSU record book with 14 career touchdown receptions. He also extended his school record for TD catches by a tight end.
- Senior quarterback **Caleb Hanie** was 20 of 27 for 229 yards, with three TDs and one overtime interception. He completed his first seven attempts until his eighth toss was dropped by true freshman Eric Peitz. After going 20-for-23 in the CU game last season, his combined totals from both contests: 40 of 50, 462 yards, four TDs, one INT.
- **Peitz** became the first true freshman to play in a game since 2005. Last season, the Rams were one of two Division I-A schools that did not use a true freshman.
- Colorado State played just its second overtime game. The Rams now are 0-2 in OT, including a 25-22 loss vs. Fresno State, Oct. 13, 2001.
- Sonny Lubick against the Buffs now is 4-4 in Denver, and 4-8 overall.
- Junior safety **Mike Pagnotta** recorded his second-career interception and his fourth-career quarterback sack.
- Special teams coach **Dave Arnold** was taken to a local hospital following the game for precautionary reasons. Treated for heat fatigue and dehydration, he was released Saturday evening and slept in his own bed. He returned to work Sunday morning, joining the rest of the Rams coaching staff in film sessions as CSU launched preparations for Saturday's home opener with Cal.

SENIOR QUARTERBACKS

- Caleb Hanie is the seventh CSU quarterback under Sonny Lubick to return as a starter in his senior season.
- Five of the six previous QBs guided CSU to bowl games in their final seasons.
- Three times during the span, senior quarterbacks led CSU to the conference title. Results of the past six senior starters, respectively:

CLOSE CALLS IN DENVER

The past six meetings with Colorado have all been narrow decisions. The six games have been decided by a total of 25 points, and none by more than a touchdown. Fittingly, that streak was punctuated by the first overtime contest in the series on Saturday.

LONE STAR STARTER

QB Caleb Hanie is the first Texan to open a season at quarterback under Rams' coach Sonny Lubick. Since 1993, the Rams have boasted a trio of Coloradans (Justin Holland 2004-05; Matt Newton 1999-2000; Ryan Eslinger 1998) and two Californians (D.J. Busch 2001; Moses Moreno 1995) to open the year. No Texan has been the team's opening-game starter in the past 50 seasons.

- In 2006 Colorado State allowed opponents 330.3 yards per game, fifth best in the conference and 57th nationally
- In 2005, CSU allowed 412.3 yards per game, seventh in the league and 92nd nationally.

SPERRY SETS RECORD

- Tight end Kory Sperry caught his fifth touchdown of the '06 season, vs. TCU Nov. 25.
- Sperry's five touchdown catches set a single-season school record for a tight end.

THE BELL TOLLS

- One of the most notable returnees for Colorado State in 2007 is RB Kyle Bell.
- In 2005, he rushed for 1,288 yards and scored 10 touchdowns, second in the Mountain West Conference and 22nd nationally.
- Bell suffered a right knee injury days before the 2006 season-opener, requiring surgical repair, but has made a full recovery.
- A junior entering '06, Bell used his redshirt last season and has two years of eligibility remaining.
- After Saturday's season opener, Bell now has seven career 100-yard rushing games (six in 2005).
- Bell fumbled only twice on 276 carries in '05.
- Bell was named first-team academic all-district and second-team academic All-American in '05.

STADIUM FACTS

Since Sonny Lubick's arrival in 1993, Colorado State has won nearly 75 percent of its home games. Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium has been the site to some of the greatest games in school history, and national and regional television broadcasts take place at nearly every home game.

The stadium lies at the base of the foothills of the Rocky Mountains, about two miles west of the main campus, and in one of the most scenic college football settings anywhere. In 2000, permanent lighting standards were installed, then 4,400 additional permanent seats were constructed in the north end zone prior to the 2004 season.

SONNY LUBICK • HEAD COACH

15th Season • Western Montana '60

Colorado State's football program has attained previously unknown heights during head coach Sonny Lubick's 15 seasons. During that time, Lubick has created a standard for excellence never before evident during the more than 100-year history of the football program.

Since taking over a program that had won just 47 games in 11 seasons with just one bowl appearance prior to his arrival in 1993, Lubick has guided the Rams' program to elite status nationally.

For example:

- Colorado State has won or shared six conference titles since 1994, more than any other Mountain West Conference member over that period;
- CSU has played in nine bowl games, more than any other league institution since 1994;
- The Rams rank among the top 20 teams in the nation in total victories since 1997;
- Lubick ranks among the top 20 NCAA Division I-A active coaches in career wins;
- Colorado State is among the leaders in MWC victories since the conference came into being in 1999.
- The Rams have seven times since Lubick's arrival won eight or more games in a season. Four times – the only four times in school history – CSU has won 10 or more games under Lubick's watchful eye.

Lubick has ushered in by far the most successful era in the history of CSU football. His fingerprint can be seen on the results on the field as well as at the turnstile.

Not only have the Rams been perennial postseason competitors, but nine of the top 10 seasons in total attendance in school history have come during his reign. Additionally, eight of the 10 largest single-game crowds in CSU history have come since his arrival.

Lubick also joined another elite list of coaches including Joe Paterno, Bobby Bowden, and Frank Beamer, in 2005 as active Division IA coaches with 100 or more career wins at their current institutions. The group includes only nine members, of which Lubick is now a member.

Interest and support of CSU's program has never been greater. The 2006 season marked the completion of an 18-month project to renovate and expand Sonny Lubick Field at Hughes Stadium. The project was made possible through a \$15.2 million gift by the Bohemian Foundation, with a caveat the stadium's playing surface be named in Lubick's honor.

The project included the installation of 4,400 new seats, the renovation of the press box and club seating area, and the addition of 12 luxury suites – each of which were sold prior to the beginning of the 2005 season.

Prior to the 2006 season, a new artificial playing surface was installed to complete the renovation.

The success enjoyed by the Rams' program under Lubick's watch has touched the entire department.

For instance, during his tenure, the department has been able to:

- Renovate and expand the stadium (\$15.2 million)
- Acquire a \$200,000 gift from former CSU all-star and current NFL All-Pro linebacker Joey Porter, who played for Lubick in the 1990's and a gift of \$75,000 from former defensive end and 10-year NFL veteran Brady Smith for program enhancements.
- Secure funding and build the McGraw Athletic Center (\$5.5 million), completed in 1999, which houses offices for every athletic department staff member, includes an academic support center, athletic marketing, promotions, and ticket offices, and breakout rooms for

football position meetings, as well as a 125-seat auditorium for team meetings and special functions;

- Renovate Moby Arena (\$4.5 million) in 1998 as part of the McGraw Center project.

Those projects alone total more than \$25 million, made possible in large part by the success CSU's football program has enjoyed since Lubick's arrival.

Lubick cares deeply about the people around him, particularly the program's student-athletes and his staff members. He has carefully built CSU's programs into one of the nation's best using a time-tested philosophy:

- Responsibility: Each member of the Rams' program is responsible for their actions and the impact on the success of the team.
- Character: Lubick places a premium on student-athletes who display integrity and honesty.
- Respect: Earning respect among peers, fans, and colleagues remains more important to the veteran coach than gaining popularity from those groups.
- Perspective: Remain on an even keel, win or lose. Lubick has those in the program focused on the goal ahead.

Lubick's impact has been felt not only in the football program or athletics department, but across the university and throughout the community:

- He was named the SPORTS ILLUSTRATED coach of the year in 1994 after leading CSU to a 10-2 record;
- In 2003, Lubick was named one of four national finalists for the Eddie Robinson Coach of Distinction Award for his community service work;
- Also in 2003, the Rams' coach was recognized by the American Diabetes Association-Colorado Chapter as "Father of the Year."
- He is an annual contributor and participant in several local and national charities including St. Jude's Children's Hospital;• In May of 2005, he was named Citizen of the Year by the Fort Collins Board of Realtors;
- Lubick and his family were honored by a local charitable organization in the winter of 2006 for their commitment and dedication to the northern Colorado community;
- In January of 2007, Lubick was named the Collins Award winner, given annually to a local figure that exemplifies leadership and service to the Fort Collins Community by the local chamber of commerce.

Lubick remains staunch in his belief a family approach is one of the reasons for Colorado State's success during his tenure.

Five of his current coaching staff members – Karl Ballard, Tom Ehlers, Darrell Funk, Dan Hammerschmidt, and his son, Marc – either played or coached under Lubick during his first stint in Fort Collins or his return beginning in 1993.

Marc joined the staff in 2005 after being on the staff of the St. Louis Rams. He replaced his older brother, Matt, who departed for a position at the University of Mississippi.

Assistants Mick Delaney and Dave Arnold both coached alongside Lubick at Montana State. Steve Stanard and James Ward had previous ties to long-time Lubick colleagues, while Jessie Williams was on the same coaching staff as Matt Lubick.

Further testament to his belief in a family atmosphere takes place after every home game. After conducting his postgame news conference and greeting wife Carol Jo, Lubick is always embraced by his three young grandchildren – Matthew, William and Emma – children of his daughter, Michelle, and son-in-law Gerard Boyle.

Lubick's smile while embracing his two youngest Rams fans reflects the same happiness CSU supporters have come to appreciate during the most successful era in school history.
